



## Cambridge City Football Club Ground Regulations

Cambridge City Football Club is open to all and has a proud history dating back to 1908. We welcome anyone regardless of age, gender, nationality, ethnic origin, sexual orientation, religion or disability.

The club is committed to creating a safe, comfortable and enjoyable experience for home and away supporters, players, officials and volunteers. Everyone has the right to enjoy the football experience free from disruptive and abusive behaviour and nobody should be intimidated at their place of work

Cambridge City Football Club expects supporters to:

- SHOW respect for our opponents, their fans, match officials and stewards, our own staff and officials.
- NOT enter the stadium either under the influence or in possession of alcohol or drugs.
- NOT engage in anti-social behaviour, including foul, offensive, insulting, abusive and racist language, use obscene gestures, fighting, throwing objects or cause distress to other supporters.
- NOT enter the stadium with any kind of pyrotechnics.
- NOT enter the field of play.
- SMOKE/VAPE only in the designated smoking areas stated in the match day programme and announced via the public address system at each home game.
- COMPLY with requests from club personnel regarding stadium operations and emergency evacuation procedures.
- BE responsible for reporting any inappropriate or discriminatory behaviour to a match day steward or a club official

**Match Day stewards** have been trained to intervene where necessary to help ensure that the above expectations are met. Any fans that choose not to adhere to these regulations or behave in an inappropriate manner bringing the Club into disrepute may be ejected from the stadium. This could lead to further disciplinary action that will be issued at the discretion of the Club Chair and Board of Directors, including a temporary or permanent ban from the Stadium

In addition, as **the FA** does not have jurisdiction over individual spectators, unless they also participate in football, action will be taken against a club for any anti-social or discriminatory behaviour displayed by its spectators. All allegations will be investigated by the FA
